



Saturday 24th February 2018

1. EVENT TITLE, DATE & VENUE

The event/practice shall be known as *DRIFT DAYZ*, to be held on the Saturday 24th February at Adelaide International Raceway, Port Wakefield Road, Virginia SA. The event is a Drifting event conducted under a RACERS permit. In addition to these Regulations, Further Regulations or instructions may be issued.

2. EVENT TIMES

The event is scheduled to start at 7.00am. The first circuit activity will be at 9.00am, and the event will finish at approximately 4.00pm on Saturday 24th February 2018.

3. ENTRY CONFIRMATION

- 3.1 Opening Date: 1st July 2017 Closing Date: (4.00pm) Friday 23rd September 2017.
- 3.2 Entries shall be made in accordance with details on the Entry Form.
- 3.3 A fee of \$80.00 (inclusive of GST) 'Early Bird' until 31st July. Then \$100.00 (inclusive of GST).
- 3.4 Entries shall be restricted to a maximum of 50 competitors, accepted by order of payment.
- 3.5 The event is open to all persons holding the appropriate RACERS licence which must be presented at the event office on the day. RACERS one day Licences may be purchased for \$25.00 on the day of the event. A RACERS annual licence (valid for 12 months) for use at RACERS permitted events may also be purchased on the day for \$65.00.
- 3.6 The organizers reserve the right to refuse any entry or if deemed appropriate, the Clerk of Course/Chief Marshall may withdraw any entry on the grounds of safety, misconduct or inappropriate behavior.

4. SAFETY CHECKS

- 4.1 **Safety Checks** will commence at 7.00am.

- 4.2. All cars must be checked and passed prior to participating. When cars are presented for safety checking they must be ready to go onto the track, i.e. with all loose objects removed and helmets in the car.
- 4.3 It will be the drivers responsibility to ensure they have their vehicle checked in time for their designated sessions.
- 4.4 Vehicles that do not pass the safety checking procedure must NOT enter the circuit at any time of the event.
- 4.5 If the vehicle is involved in an incident or accident on or off the circuit, the car must be re-checked before it returns to the circuit.

5. ALCOHOL

- 5.1 There is to be no alcohol consumed by anyone in the venue at anytime throughout the day.
- 5.2 Any driver or pit crew found with alcohol will be required to leave.
- 5.3 Any entrant judged by the Clerk of Course/Chief Marshall to be affected by alcohol shall be excluded forthwith from the event and incur such penalties as deemed appropriate by the Chief Marshall.
- 5.4 Drivers will be held responsible for their pit crew and sponsors. Any team member found to be in breach of these rules may result in the driver being EXCLUDED from the event.

6. DRIVER REQUIREMENTS

- 6.1 Every person who participates in a RACERS sanctioned event must hold a valid, current RACERS competition licence.
- 6.2 Drivers Apparel: While on course drivers must at all times:
 - Wear a helmet bearing any of the following markings are approved for use: AS 1698, Australian Standard; Snell SA 90, M90, SA95, SA 2000.
 - Wear clothing which is non-flammable which provides full cover from the throat to the wrists and the base ankles.
 - Clothing must NOT be of Nylon or similar material. Drivers are encouraged to wear a one piece driving suit, but it is not compulsory.
 - Footwear must be enclosed, cover the foot completely, and have a flat sole. Driving shoes that cover the ankle are encouraged but not compulsory.
- 6.3 Seat Belts and Competition Harness Systems: All cars require a Seat belt or a Competition Harness system for the Drivers seat. A quick release type approved safety belt and shoulder harness of not less than 40 mm in width is compulsory. Where the belts pass through the seat sides, the holes must have a grommet installed, be rolled and/or padded to prevent cutting of the belt. Shoulder belts of Competition Harness systems must be mounted/secured within 45 degrees of Horizontal.

7. PASSENGER RIDES

- 7.1 Passengers are required to complete a Disclaimer form and pay \$30. A specific wrist-band will be issued to authorised passengers. Passengers must be 13 years of age and older. Passengers under 18 years of age will require a parent/guardian to sign and indemnity form for them.
- 7.2 Entrants with passengers must have an approved roll cage and the front passenger seat is fitted with a Competition Harness system or factory fitted seat belt.
- 7.3 The passenger must at all times while in the car wear a helmet bearing any of the following markings as approved for use: AS 1698, Australian Standard; Snell SA 90, M90, SA95, SA 2000.
- 7.4 Passengers must wear clothing which is non-flammable which provides full cover from the throat to the wrists and ankles. The material of this clothing must NOT be of Nylon or similar material.
- 7.5 Entrants are responsible for ensuring their passengers safety and meet the general passenger requirements listed below. Penalties will apply if there is any breach of these requirements.
- 7.6 Drivers are expected to drive responsibly while they have passengers in their vehicle.
- 7.7 Personal accident Insurance does not apply to passengers.

8. VEHICLE BREAKDOWN

- 8.1 If your vehicle stops or suffers a mechanical malfunction on any part of the circuit and it cannot continue under its own power, turn on your hazard lights and track crew will come to your assistance.
- 8.2 DO NOT leave your vehicle until the track crew advises you to do so. You may only get out of your car on the track if your vehicle is on fire.

9. SUMMARY of CIRCUIT RULES

- Listen to and obey all instructions given by officials.
- Show your wrist-band at pit exit.
- Helmets and seat belts must be secured at all times on the circuit.
- The speed between the '*witches hats*' in the slow down area is 5km/h.
- When passing the finish lines '*witches hats*', slow 5km. Do not increase your speed until you have passed the second set of '*witches hats*' before the next start line.
- No loose objects in your car (cameras, water bottles, phones, wheel brace etc.)
- All cameras on or in cars must be checked for mounting security.
- The maximum exhaust noise level permitted for cars in this event is 95 dBA.
- No static burnouts or donuts. If you receive a second warning you will be excluded from the event.
- If you spin, remain off the track in a safe position until the next vehicle(s) has passed.
- If you have a problem and stop on the circuit;

- Warning/flashing lights to be turned on.
 - Wait for help
 - Do not get out of your car and walk around.
- Don't ever drive against the flow of traffic.
- NEVER drift past a stopped car. Slow down and grip up until you are past the incident.
- You will be advised of your last lap and at the end of your session you are to go into the pits under grip with hazard lights on.
- When returning to the pit paddock;
 - Warning/flashing lights to be turned on.
 - When instructed to return, do so immediately.
 - Do not cross the centre of the circuit.
 - Return at approx 40km/h.
- If you are aware that your vehicle is leaking oil, move off the track immediately.
- Cars must be set up for drifting. If officials are of the opinion that your car is not correctly set up and/or not be safe, you will not be able to continue. Please ensure that;
 - Your vehicle has no fluid leaks
 - No loose objects in your car (cameras, water bottles, phones, wheel brace etc.)
 - All lights are in working order.
 - Seat, seatbelts/harnesses are mounted securely and are in good condition.
 - Suspension/steering components are in good working order.
- Alcohol is **not permitted** in the venue. Drivers will be excluded from the event if their team/friends are found to be consuming alcohol in your area.
- **Waste oil must be taken away with you.**
- **All used tyres must be taken away with you.**
